

Resolution presented by the delegation of the

Republic of Cameroon

Theme International conflict and security

Subject Prohibition of military bases on foreign soil

The General Assembly,

Outraged by the presence of American, Russian and Chinese military bases on the territory of many countries, which are thus suffering a serious attack on their national sovereignty

Outraged by the fact that such a presence is in direct contravention of Article 2, paragraph 4 of the Charter of the United Nations, which stipulates that members shall refrain in international relations from the threat or use of force against the territorial integrity or political independence of any state

Shocked that this phenomenon has become normalized, an immediate ban on new foreign military bases, as well as the removal of any existing bases, which, under the pretext of pseudo armed support, actually subject the countries where they are located to the domination of the United States, Russia and China, should be immediately instituted,

Alarmed by the fact that the so-called right of expulsion by the host country never materializes in practice,

Supporting the fact that the promise of economic development by means of rents collected by the host countries is a sham, as military bases are in reality only used to establish the power of the country to which the military base belongs over the politics of the host country

Adding that the argument that military bases ensure international stability and security is similarly misleading and fallacious,

Decides - to prohibit the creation of these enslaving bases, in favor of the sovereignty of the countries that have been duped by the United States, Russia, and China, the main protagonists of these unscrupulous methods;

- To proceed little by little to the dismantling of the existing bases.
