Resolution presented by the delegations of Kenya and the African Union

Theme Conflict and International Security

Concerning the creation of an effective military power in Africa

The General Assembly,

Noting the ineffectiveness of some African governments and the measures in place

to deal with terrorism and corruption.

Recalling that terrorism is a global scourge and a source of many tensions and conflicts

between countries. Therefore, its disappearance is a priority for the good of

all.

Underlining that Africa is the continent most affected by terrorism as most victims are

deplored in Africa.

Pointing out that a possible military coordination between African countries could provide

the necessary means to fight terrorism while strengthening relations within the

African continent

Affirming that the eradication of terrorism and corruption in Africa offers the opportunity

for countries to develop, to improve relations with other countries, to reduce insecurity in Africa while benefiting from the presence of an international army

in relation with other military powers

Concluding that if terrorism is to be stopped, it must be eradicated at its source with more

effective means than those used today, while taking advantage of bringing the

countries of Africa closer together in order to make the continent more stable

Proposes - the creation of an international African military power led by solely African

states for the purpose of reducing terrorism and building better relations

within the continent

- financial support from the UN and African countries to materialise the necessary infrastructures of the project, such as the construction of

anti-terrorist military and educational training centres for counter-terrorism.

- the collaboration of interested African states to ensure the success of such a

project.
