Stunned	by the threat of territorial invasion endured by 14 States in the world, including Taiwan,
Worried	by the lack of international and military security experienced by the latter,
Deploring	the inequality of research and possession of deterrent weapons in the world,
Dismayed	by the opposition of certain States to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW), including the permanent states of the UN Security Council.
Observing	that 3.5% of the world's population is at risk, at any time, of having to leave their homes under the threat of States having military and nuclear ascendancy,
Recalling	that 14 States in the world possess nuclear weapons,
Decides	the establishment of an interstate military and nuclear alliance in the form of a Confederation, comprising all the states threatened militarily and territorially, closely linked to the UN;
-	that this Confederation allows collaboration between its member states on nuclear research as well as military collaboration;
	that the criteria making it possible to integrate these States be included in a Charter, the elements of which will be precise;
	that this same Charter includes the conditions for the production and use of nuclear weapons, the main condition of which remains the exceptional use event of defense against an imminent and estimable attack, directly threatening the safety of the population concerned;
	that military aid and interventions, whether in the form of arms or soldiers, be just as conditioned, the main condition here being based on a significant inability of the attacked State to defend itself;
	that nuclear research, armaments and travel be financed by the member states in proportion to their GDP, i.e. 5% of the latter, as well as 3% of UN funds.
