RÉSOLUTION I - REPUBLIC OF SAN MARINO

THEME: POLITICAL AND SOCIAL RIGHTS

CONCERN: THE FIGHT AGAINST FORCED CHILD MARRIAGE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Alarmed that one in five women in the world is forcibly married before the age of 18,

Recalling that forced marriage jeopardizes the life and future prospects of a child, increases the risk of

mortality and the child's vulnerability to violence and abuse,

Scandalized by the transgression of article 16, paragraph 2 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights

stating that "marriage can only be concluded with the free and full consent of the future

spouses",

Accusing Niger, the Central African Republic, Chad, Mali, Mozambique, Burkina Faso and many other

states to practice such atrocities,

Decides to introduce a fine of 500 US Dollars for every illegal marriage, a sum which will go to an

investment fund dedicated to the cause, promoting good living conditions for these young

victims,

the immediate cancellation of all marriages of non-consenting children since 2008,

to establish an international minimum age of marriage of 18 years,

to send a UN team to sensitize the religious and political leaders in the affected regions.
