## RESOLUTION X - REPUBLIC OF GUINEA BISSAU

THEME: 2030 AGENDA FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

CONCERN: FISC (FISHERIES INTERNATIONAL SUPERVISION COMMITTEE) TO COMBAT

**ILLEGAL FISHING** 

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Notes that illegal fishing causes around USD 50 billion in economic losses every year, making it

the third most lucrative ecological crime after illegal logging and illegal mining,

Emphasises that USD 6 billion in the AESAN region alone and USD 2.3 billion in the Gulf of Guinea are

lost annually through illegal fishing and that more and more fishermen are resorting to illegal

means,

Is concerned that illegal fishing not only causes major economic losses, but also leads to a sharp

reduction in fish stocks in the long term, which contributes to the depletion of one of the

most important sources of food for many people,

Is alarmed that no effective measures have yet been taken and that people in the countries concerned

are suffering from consequences such as food shortages and famine,

Recalls that the EU, as one of the largest players in fisheries with a total of around 80,000 fishing

vessels, has committed itself to putting an end to illegal fishing by 2020, but that no

improvements have yet been seen;

Decides to establish the WTO-funded Fisheries International Supervision Committee (FISC), which is

responsible for combating illegal fishing and identifying the countries affected by illegal

fishing;

Establishes that this organisation shall set up at least one control and advisory station in each country

concerned to support the local fisheries control authorities in order to effectively curb illegal

fishing.
