RESOLUTION XI – GREECE

THEME: RESOLUTION OF ACTUALITY

CONCERN: EFFECTIVE SUPPRESSION OF ILLEGAL MIGRATION

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Alarmed by the consequent foreign migration hitting Europe, exerting an unacceptable pressure on

the economy, as testified by the 30,000 illegal migrants who have crossed the "Manche", as indicated by the statistics revealed on January 1, 2024 by the governments concerned,

notably the United Kingdom,

Observing the lack of concrete and significant measures put in place to contain this phenomenon,

leading to numerous tragedies, such as that of December 15, 2023, when 61 illegal immigrants perished in the Mediterranean Sea, bringing the total number of deaths in this maritime area in 2023 to over 2,300, caused by the negligence and passivity of the nations

from which the migrants originate, Turkey and Eritrea in particular,

Conscious of the absolute necessity of strengthening laws and sanctions against illegal immigration, as

well as putting in place systems to prevent immigration or limit its economic and social impact, and therefore the need to reinforce all possible measures to repel this scourge that

plagues us,

Decides to introduce a tax system of 1% of GDP on nations that make little or no effort to stem migration from their countries. This tax would be paid back to countries that are heavily

affected by migration, such as Greece, the United Kingdom and France;

- to allow illegal immigrants to be employed on an unpaid basis for the duration of their stay on the various European territories, the aim of this measure being to cover the costs incurred by the upkeep of these immigrants, and to temporarily provide them with better

living conditions.
