RESOLUTION VII – UKRAINE

THEME: CONFLICTS AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

CONCERN: PROHIBITION OF FINANCIAL OR MATERIAL SUPPORT TO WARS OF AGGRESSION

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Indignant by the increasing number of wars of aggression which, in the four corners of the globe, kill

innocent human beings,

Revolted by the fact that in this same room, many countries such as the Russian Federation, the

People's Republic of China and so many other countries finance by deceitful means certain

armed conflicts,

Recalling that all forms of financial or material support to a war of aggression is formally prohibited by

the Charter of the United Nations which stipulates in Article 2, paragraph 4, that the members of the organization refrain, in their international relations to use threat or use of force either against the territorial integrity or political independence of any State, or in any

other manner incompatible with the aims of the United Nations,

Noting that through these illegal supports, these countries directly contradict the pacifist goals of

the organization of the United Nations,

Flabbergasted that the international community remain static in the face of these prolong the duration of

these wars of aggression and thus increase the number of human losses,

Finds that this phenomenon is so widespread today that Syria, Iran and Turkey are no longer even

trying to hide the billions sent to the terrorist group Hamas,

Decides to seize the property and assets of States financially or materially supporting a war of

aggression whose sole purpose is to shed blood;

to sign a UN treaty prohibiting all countries sitting in this room from financing armed

aggression in any way.
