

## RESOLUTION IX – ARAB REPUBLIC OF EGYPT

THEME : CONFLICTS AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

CONCERN : AMERICAN-EUROPEAN INTERFERENCE

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

- Concerned by the tinderbox situation in the Middle East and Europe for two years,
- Regretting the general inability to realize the seriousness of these conflicts, and the possible purposes of these conflicts if they are poorly managed and underestimated,
- Remarking that the Western Empire once again stands out for its interference in these wars, and that there are more and more voices raised against these dangerous empires guilty of many war crimes, and that one voice Africa and the Middle East should be heard more in these conflicts,
- Reminding that such self-interested interference can lead to dangerous escalations of war, which could result in a potential Third World War as some experts fear, and that it is necessary to collaborate in order to prevent such a disastrous fate at all costs, and that it would be inconsiderate to hand over the destiny of international relations to the United States.
- Decide to make drastic decisions, to fight fiercely in order to definitively put an end to American-European hegemony, too unstable and slow for the situation that concerns us:
- reconsider the countries having the right of veto, a situation preventing many humanitarian progress and slowing down the majority of them,
  - Fine more severely the countries guilty of war crimes, today and especially tomorrow, in the process of giving visibility to developing countries,
  - Minimize intrusive American influence in European conflicts, and in developing countries,
  - Opt for a peace process like our administration in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict in order to promote understanding rather than one-upmanship in the Gaza Strip, as proposed by our President Abdel Fattah al-Sissi,
