RESOLUTION XIII -Brunei Darussalam

THEME: POLITICAL AND SOCIAL RIGHTS

CONCERN: THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTERNATIONAL JUDICIAL ORDER AND THE CREATION OF LAWKEEPERS

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Saddened by the staggering number of 1.5 billion people betrayed by the justice system of

their country, victims of unresolved judicial issues,

Scandalized by the corruption of the highest French and American judicial authorities where

judges abuse their power judges and show bias while remaining unpunished,

Outraged by the slowness of legal proceedings in certain countries such as Greece and

Italy, which last an average of 1.5 year, during which criminals remain

unpunished,

Disheartened by the sense of insecurity felt by the populations due to failing judicial systems

and impunity benefiting delinquents, often leading to street justice and societal

chaos,

Accusing the often overloaded judicial systems, unable to judge the crimes and offenses

in their country, of acquitting the accused due to lack of resources and leaving

them into thin air.

Adding that impunity of delinquency leads to a vicious circle of recurring misdeeds and

that a too lenient judgment leaves room for a high rate of repeated offenses,

Outlining that the judicial system of Brunei has succeeded with its efficient and impartial

but fair judgment in creating a preventive and appropriate system meeting the

needs of its population,

Decides to create a high international judicial authority, independent of the ICC and

funded by the UN as well as by international partners and other willing member

states, which will help states with insufficient judicial resources;

- to establish a strict international penal code for all based on deterrence and

respecting Human Rights and human dignity, which would set on equal footing

the penal codes of all States in the world;

to train and provide to all states judges, prosecutors and other qualified staff,

called Lawkeepers, to apply this new code impartially;

that the countries wishing to receive this aid, to expedite procedures and ease their judicial system, agree to comply with the international penal code and the

impartial and fair judgments of the Lawkeepers.
