RESOLUTION XIV - TAJIKISTAN

THEME: CONFLICTS AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

CONCERN: Prohibition of financial or material support to wars of aggression

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Outraged

Recalling

by the growing scale of drug trafficking, which fuels international criminal networks and exacerbates crises of security and public health across the globe, that this issue far exceeds the borders of Tajikistan and extends to other states in Central Asia, Africa, the Balkans, and numerous nations in Latin America, where cartels funded by international demand sow terror and fuel massive human rights violations,

Appalled

that these traffics aim to supply the massive consumer markets of Europe, Russia, and North America, which have systematically failed to reduce demand, while smaller countries like Tajikistan, as frontline states for drug transit (1,800 tons of heroin and opium from Afghanistan annually), bear the heavy burden of monitoring and combating this scourge alone,

Accusing

these same countries, whose consumption levels far exceed those of other nations, of being responsible for a cycle of violence, corruption, and destabilization in transit and production countries, while turning a blind eye to the helplessness of these smaller transit states,

Decides:

- to seize the assets of states and companies that profit from or ignore the transit and consumption of international drugs,
- to negotiate an international treaty binding all countries, particularly the primary consumer countries, to take concrete measures to reduce domestic drug demand and strengthen border control mechanisms,
- to tax drug-consuming countries, whose financial assistance to transit states remains negligible, forcing the latter to fight with limited resources.
