

RESOLUTION XV – YEMEN

THEME : CONFLICTS AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

CONCERN : DISSOLUTION OF THE UN

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

- Dismayed by the UN's inability to manage conflicts such as those in Palestine, Yemen, Rwanda, Myanmar, to name a few, to achieve its development goals such as eradicating extreme poverty for all, to guarantee respect for human rights, and by its hypocrisy in the distribution of funds,
- Devastated by the countless wars that have erupted since the creation of the League of Nations and later the UN, which have only worsened, such as the conflicts in Lebanon, Mali, and the Russian-Ukraine war,
- Emphasizing the inefficiency of the UN in responding to global crises, evident in the inability of its peacekeepers to prevent genocides, such as Rwanda in 1994 or Bosnia-Herzegovina in 1995, where their presence not only failed to protect civilians but at times exacerbated violence, as well as its persistent inaction in conflicts such as those in Palestine and Lebanon, where despite calls for ceasefires, no concrete measures are taken,
- Adding that in parallel, the organization struggles to meet its sustainable development goals, as shown by fact that in 2022, 9.2% of the global population still suffered from hunger, and 84 million youths are at risk of lacking access to education by 2030, highlighting its blatant inability to address major global challenges despite its speeches and resolutions,
- Informing that the UN is not indispensable, that countries can de-escalate their conflicts independently, and that alliances between countries such as the EU, BRICS, or the G27 are actors that still enable states to maintain their economic and political relations,
- Clarifying that agencies such as UNICEF, UNHCR, and others are nonetheless useful and can continue to exist while managing themselves with financial support from the world's nations,
- Decides to dissolve the UN and thus grant the countries of the world the freedom to form their own alliances and better manage global affairs ;
- that if some countries choose not to leave the UN, they will face an organization that will have less impact due to its diminished membership.
