

Resolution presented by the Delegation of the Republic of Poland

Theme: Conflicts and international security

Concerns: Establishment of the Fund for Peaceful Security and Humanitarian Protection (FPSHP) to support the purchase of military equipment and gear for nations acting in accordance with international law

The General Assembly,

Alarmed by the growing number of armed conflicts worldwide, reminiscent of those experienced during the 20th century and threatening international peace and security;

Recalling that Poland, at the crossroads of empires and often called the "gateway to Europe," has faced repeated aggression and therefore values the safeguarding of national sovereignty and defense;

Affirming that the UN Charter and international law recognize the right of nations to ensure their security and uphold the primary purpose of maintaining international peace;

Concerned by the unprecedented rise in state-based conflicts worldwide, the highest number since 1946, endangering global peace and stability, and causing devastating humanitarian consequences;

Noting that peace sometimes requires adequate defense, as the Latin proverb "Si vis pacem, para bellum" ("If you want peace, prepare for war") suggests, a principle echoed by Secretary of War Pete Hegseth, who emphasizes that visible strength deters adversaries;

Acknowledging that rising global conflicts threaten peace and stability, while affirming the right of nations to maintain and modernize their defenses in accordance with international law;

Evoking Articles 1, 2, 33, and 51 of the UN Charter, which encourage the peaceful resolution of conflicts through negotiation, mediation, and arbitration, while recognizing the right of Member States to self-defence;

Encourages Member States to contribute financially to security, stability, and world peace;

Requests that the General Assembly, through the FPSHP, promote Member States' actions in accordance with international norms and principles of security, and encourage investments in defense and humanitarian protection, aiming to mobilize an initial capital of USD 2 billion from nations acting in accordance with the UN Charter, international law, and the principles of peace, security, and human rights.
