

RESOLUTION V – OMAN

THEME : POLITICAL AND SOCIAL RIGHTS

CONCERN : THE DISAPPEARANCE OF CULTURES

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Outraged by the global phenomenon of cultural identity loss due to demographic imbalance caused by high migration rates, for example in Oman, where nearly 43% of the population is foreign, in certain Gulf countries, where this rate reaches 80%, or even in Europe, where the Great Replacement affects one in five people,

Stating that the shortage of local labor is due to a decline in birth rates, creating a growing demand for foreign workers and thus encouraging excessive migration,

Concerned by the alarming decline in the global fertility rate, which fell to just 2.2 children per woman in 2023 according to the World Bank,

Denouncing the disappearance of our children due to the increasing participation of women in the labor market, forced to abandon their natural roles because their income is insufficient to support their households, which weakens families, the fundamental pillar of all of our societies,

Shocked by the lack of official recognition of domestic work and the inability of international institutions, including the ILO, to ensure fair remuneration,

Applauding countries that have successfully implemented appropriate policies to promote birth rates, such as the Nordic countries, while recalling that the preservation of cultures and traditions is of crucial importance and concerns the whole world,

Decides to introduce a tax called the Fee Applied to Independent Ladies (FAIL), levied on the income of women over the age of 20 who are employed and unmarried, with the aim of financing improvements in women's rights within marriage, supporting the remuneration of housewives, and encouraging childbirth ;

- to create an official status for housewives, recognized by the UN and the ILO, to promote this role that is so essential to the preservation of our societies and to give it the economic visibility it deserves, as it ensures the transference of our cultures, with women being the guardians of education and traditions ;

- to encourage nations to set maximum immigration quotas per economic sector, based on each country's birth rate and unemployment rate, in order to preserve jobs for locals and limit the risk of cultural erosion linked to the disproportionate number of foreigners.
