

RESOLUTION VI – SOUTH AFRICA

THEME : POLITICAL AND SOCIAL RIGHTS

CONCERN : CREATION OF A UN COMMUNITY AGAINST INEQUALITY

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Alarmed that 1% of the world's population owns nearly half of its wealth, while the countries of the Global South, which account for 79% of the population, hold only 31% of its wealth,

Noting the ageing populations of countries in the Global North, such as Japan, Italy, Germany and Portugal, leading to a labour shortage accompanied by an increase in demand for pension benefits,

Deploring the fact that birth in a given country unfairly determines rights, income and life prospects, thus creating significant inequalities within the global population, passports become instruments of discrimination limiting the mobility of citizens, mainly from countries in the South,

Indignant by the sad observation that current conflicts are often fuelled by economic inequalities, ethnic tensions and imperialist ambitions, thus leading to the rise of a global oligarchy that influences international political decisions and weakens the role of the UN,

Recalling that international peace and social justice can only be achieved through enhanced cooperation and global solidarity,

Decides to create the HESS, a UN community involving the issuance of a passport to every human being at birth, regardless of their nationality of origin, which would promote international exchanges ;

- to implement a system of resettlement quotas for UN citizens, calculated not only on the basis of demand but also on the basis of availability, in countries with low birth rates or labour shortages, in order to encourage controlled and beneficial migration and to stimulate the flow of ideas and resources between countries ;
- to restore the historical role of the UN with the aim of ensuring fair and harmonious global governance.
