

RESOLUTION XI – MEXICO

THEME : CONFLICTS AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

CONCERN : LEGALIZATION AND STATE PRODUCTION OF DRUGS

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Alerted by the ineffectiveness of the measures massively put in place by the different states against the various traffics and networks related to the narcotics industry,

Noting during the last decade the exponential enrichment of gangs and cartels involved internationally in multiple illegal activities related to drug trafficking,

Scandalized by the devastating effects of conflicts caused by drug trafficking around the world (settling scores and collateral victims (450,000 dead and 70,000 missing between 2006 and 2024), hostage taking, corruption, etc.) as well as the deplorable working conditions to which the small workforce is exposed at the various stages of the production, transport and sales process (dealers and lookouts sometimes aged 10 years, etc.),

Expecting each consumer to assume their individual responsibility and inquire about the possible consequences of taking drugs,

Recalling the fact that many doctors and experts consider other substances for free sale (legal sale), such as tobacco and alcohol, much more harmful to the health of the consumer than most drugs (crack, heroin, etc.),

Decides to have a state-based, taxed and regulated production of drugs in order to improve its consumption conditions and increase the tax revenues of the State ;

- to use these revenues to fund a prevention and awareness campaign against drug use among young people ;
- to introduce specific laws aimed at regulating State drug production (production quotas) and its consumption (legal age, presentation of identity cards for purchase, etc.) ;
- to have a plan for the professional retraining of anti-drug brigades (in the field of security of future production infrastructures, awareness raising among young people about drugs and their consumption, etc.).
